

## **Outreach Terms and Conditions**

We're excited to deliver an outreach session for your group! Before booking, please ensure you have read and accepted our Terms and Conditions.

## **Payments:**

- Payments made for outreach sessions are non-refundable.
- We accept payment by BACS credit or debit card payment as well as organisation cheques. Please allow time for the cheque to clear before date of visit.
- We do not accept personal cheques, Electron cards or American Express.
  - Cheques should be made payable to Hertfordshire Zoo (we are unable to accept cheques made payable to any other name/abbreviation).
- Full payment must be received at least 10 days in advance of your scheduled session. Late payments made after your scheduled session will incur a £50 administration fee.
- A 10% cancellation fee will be applied should your session be no longer required once an invoice has been raised.
- Outreach sessions cannot be paid for using vouchers and cannot be combined with any other promotions or discounts.
- Hertfordshire Zoo reserves the right to alter our prices at any time. If you booked and paid for your visit before a price increase, the original price at the time of booking will be honoured.

## **Venue & Set-Up Requirements:**

- The group is responsible for providing a suitable venue for the session.
- The venue must be safe, accessible, and appropriate for the agreed number of participants.
- Adequate seating, tables, and any agreed resources must be set up prior to the start of the session.
- Access to electricity, audio-visual equipment, or other specific resources (if required)
  must be confirmed in advance.

## **Session Delivery:**

- Content will be agreed upon between the group and our education team prior to the session.
- Any specific requests, adaptations, or learning objectives must be communicated no later than 10 days before the session date.
- Once confirmed, changes to the content may not be possible.
- At least one responsible adult/leader must remain present throughout the session to support behaviour management and safeguarding.

Please note, that Hertfordshire Zoo does not use live animals in education sessions at the Zoo or during outreach visits.
